**JANUARY 20, 2026**

At 6:02pm this meeting was called to order by Municipal Clerk, Mary Canesi. This meeting was properly advertised in the Press of Atlantic City on January 10, 2026, and in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

**FLAG SALUTE**

The flag salute was led by Mayor Chau.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

**Councilman Polistina** – Finance and Collections; Library; Municipal Alliance; Senior Citizens; Affordable Housing

Councilman Polistina had no report.

**Councilman Dewees** – Buildings/Grounds, Athletic Fields; Birch Grove Park, Bike Path, 1<sup>st</sup> Street Playground, Veterans Park; Public Works; Roads, Engineering; Stormwater Sewer Operations

Councilman Dewees reported Public Works was moving through town cutting branches that get in the way of trucks, cleaning drainage basins, and also working on the disc golf course.

**Councilwoman Kern** – Inspections, Housing/Zoning; Northfield Sports (FAN); Library; Mainland Regional

Councilwoman Kern congratulated football and cheer, adding that she had wanted them to do a cheer where they say ‘08225’, but that involved stunts. She announced that the varsity teams will be here on February 24<sup>th</sup>. She met the new library director, Mia Fabi and Councilwoman Kern would be attending the next meeting. The library offered many programs for all. She congratulated the seven musicians from Mainland who auditioned for the All-South Jersey Honors Band Ensemble and announced the next Mainland Board of Education meeting for January 26th at 6pm.

**Councilwoman Bucci** – Insurance and Safety; Planning Board; Economic Development / Chamber of Commerce

Councilwoman Bucci had no report but said she has made it her mission to visit as many businesses as possible in 2026.

**Councilman Smith** - Central Municipal Court; Little League and Babe Ruth; Northfield Community School; Shared Services; Grants

Councilman Smith received notice from the Assignment Judge for Superior Court requesting a meeting with stakeholders, he hoped he could make that meeting and was looking forward to an end of year report. Northfield Little League softball and baseball sign ups were under way for the spring season. The next Northfield Community School Board of Education meeting is scheduled for January 26<sup>th</sup>.

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**Councilwoman Carfagno** - Fire Department / EMS; Technology / MRHS Channel; Cultural Committee / Veteran Liaison

Councilwoman Carfagno announced she had just placed another order for the Hometown Hero Program. She hoped to have photos with the families before they were installed. The Cultural Committee will be meeting at the Museum this Saturday at 10am. The next 250<sup>th</sup> meeting is scheduled for this Thursday, January 22<sup>nd</sup> at 5pm at City Hall. She thanked Clerk Canesi for proactively working on the website so it is ADA compliant, it was a lot of work to ensure compliance – she thanked Clerk Canesi for that. Councilwoman Carfagno read the Fire and EMS reports for December, including year to date. The end of year totals far exceeded calls in recent years, she thanked the Fire Department for all they do and for keeping us safe.

**Councilman Notaro** – Sanitary Sewer Operations

Councilman Notaro reported the Sewer Department has been doing manhole inspections and necessary line maintenance, they are keeping up well on our system, with service and maintenance. There were 154 utility mark-outs this month, which would require road opening permits. He noted sewer flow totals and thanked Superintendent Boyd, keep up the good work. Regarding the valytics software, it was in the solicitor's hands now and we would be moving forward with the free trial. if it works out and we like it, we will move forward.

Councilwoman Carfagno announced the committee was working on something and it would be sent to the solicitor for review.
