### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City is the owner of that certain parcel of real property known and designated as Lot 17.01 in Block 38 on the Tax Map of the City of Northfield, Atlantic County, New Jersey (the "City Property"), which property is presently unimproved but requires periodic maintenance; and

WHEREAS, Lee is the owner of that certain parcel of real property known and designated as Lot 18.11 in Block 38 on the Tax Map of the City of Northfield, Atlantic County, New Jersey (the "Lee Property"), which property is adjacent to the City Property; and

WHEREAS, the City requires, and Lee agrees to provide, temporary rights of vehicular and pedestrian access, ingress and egress over and upon the Lee Property in order to maintain the City Property.

WHEREAS, it is Lee's independent desire to grant to the City temporary rights of vehicular and pedestrian access, ingress and egress over and upon the Lee Property in order to maintain the City Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and other good and valuable consideration, Lee agrees that the City is hereby granted temporary rights of vehicular and pedestrian access, ingress and egress over and upon the Lee Property in order to maintain the City Property starting on March \_\_\_\_, 2017 and ending on March \_\_\_\_, 2017.

The parties covenant for themselves, and all of their successors in right, title and interest, as follows:

- 1. GRANT OF LICENSE. Lee hereby grants to the City temporary rights of vehicular and pedestrian access, ingress and egress over and upon the Lee Property in order to maintain the City Property a temporary license to use the Lee Property.
- 2. PERMITTED USE. The City is hereby permitted temporary rights of vehicular and pedestrian access, ingress and egress over and upon the Lee Property in order to maintain the City Property a

temporary license to use the Lee Property. Use shall commence no earlier than 8:30 a.m. and shall cease no later than 5:00 p.m.

- 3. TERM OF LICENSE. The term of this License is for \_\_\_\_ days commencing on March \_\_\_, 2017 and ending on March \_\_\_, 2017. On March \_\_\_, 2017, this license agreement shall automatically terminate and the City shall immediately cease any permitted use hereunder, repair all damage resulting from the City's use of the Lee Property and reasonably restore the Lee Property to its good condition as it existed prior to the date of this agreement.
- 4. FEE & PAYMENT. The consideration of this agreement shall be \$1.00 and other good and valuable consideration.
- 5. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This agreement constitutes and contains the entire agreement between the parties with regard to the use of the Lee Property. There are no other understandings or agreements between the parties other than are set forth in this written document. The parties may not change, amend or modify this agreement unless the change, amendment or modification is in writing and signed by both parties.
- 6. SIGNATURES. The parties agree that this agreement may be transmitted and delivered between them by facsimile machine (fax). The parties intend that faxed signatures constitute original signatures and that a faxed agreement containing the signatures (original or faxed) of all parties is binding on all parties.

### AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4-2017, AS INTRODUCED ON FEBRUARY 14, 2017

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 4-2017, an Ordinance Amending Chapter 215 of the Code of the City of Northfield Governing Land Use and Development, was introduced and passed on first reading at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Northfield held on February 14, 2017; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:55D-26a, Ordinance No. 4-2017 was referred to the Municipal Planning Board for review and comment; and

WHEREAS, in a letter dated March 3, 2017, the Municipal Planning Board indicated their approval of Ordinance No. 4-2017 as introduced, and further recommended an additional change as follows (added text <u>underlined</u>; deleted text <u>stricken</u>):

### § 215-32 Commercial vehicle storage.

- A. No commercial motor vehicle having a rated manufacturer's carrying capacity in excess of greater than 1 1/2 tons shall be parked or stored overnight on any occupied property which is primarily used for residential purposes or on any property in a residentially zoned area, except for vehicles engaged in construction parked or stored on an active construction site. This provision shall not apply to passenger automobiles with commercial motor vehicle registration.
